Now the Habit Grill, this was once
an iconic diner that opened in 1960

student to hang out. There are 4
murals to see.

'Greatest Generation' (2006) Commemorating WWII, it depicts 29 people across a wall 24 feet high and 71 feet wide. It was painted on Dibond tiles and affixed to wall; by Artist Glen W. Hill
